COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will provide an introduction to the major technologies of the ancient Mediterranean world. We will study topics such as aqueducts and pyramids, metalworking and pottery, as well as innovative military technology and automata. I encourage those who have skills in programming, animation, drawing, or model-making to consider a practical project as a term assignment; presentations and posters are also good alternatives for those who prefer them over essays.

CORE COMPETENCIES

This course will make students think critically about the technologies of different cultures of the past, and reflect on them in relation to the modern world.
