# **COURSE OBJECTIVE:**

This course will provide an introduction to four important genres of Latin literature (the novel, epic, drama, and satire). There will be a stress on what comedy meant to a Roman audience, as well as what they understood by tragedy – what made them laugh and what made them cry. Assessments will be based on texts interpreted in class, so attendance is essential.

# **COURSE REQUIREMENTS:**

- 1. An essay of 1000 words, due mid-term (Oct 24). Essay questions will be distributed. Each question will involve the analysis of <u>two</u> of the authors studied in class. The essay will require a bibliography of at least six items (two of which must be books).
- 2. An essay of 2000 words, due at the end of term (Dec 6). Essay questions will be distributed. Each question will involve the analysis of <u>two</u> of the authors studied in class (different to those discussed in the first essay). The essay will require a bibliography of at least six items (two of which must be books).
