**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is a continuation of LATI 201 and 203, covering Chapters 28-40 of *Wheelock's Latin*. It completes the grammatical study of the Latin language, with an emphasis on the skills and knowledge necessary for reading ancient Latin texts. The language learned in this course is Classical Latin, the language of the Roman writers Livy, Vergil and Horace. Knowledge of Classical Latin is the foundation for reading Mediaeval and Renaissance Latin.

**CORE COMPETENCIES**

Strengthening of grammatical, linguistic and translation skills. By the end of the course, you will have reached the level where you can move on to read original works.
