### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Intensive in-class translation practice based on text of intermediate difficulty, with review of grammar and syntax as required. Students will attempt seen as well as unseen passages on the final exam. Texts from the Early Christian Era will be included.

## **COURSE REQUIREMENTS:**

1.	10 weekly take home sight translations starting January 31	30%
2.	1 mid-term exam	20%
3.	1 final exam (seen and unseen passages)	50%
