Weingreen, Jacob. *A Practical Grammar for Classical Hebrew*. Second edition. Oxford: Oxford University Press, 1959.

Course Description:

The course provides an introductory study of classical Hebrew grammar and vocabulary, including orthography, phonetics, syntax declensions of nouns and conjugations of verbs. Prior knowledge of classical Hebrew is not required. The course emphasizes acquisition of practical reading and grammar skills; it is designed for Religious Studies majors who need to read the Bible in the original language. Although the course provides an introductory study of classical Hebrew grammar and literature. Though the grammar and vocabulary of biblical Hebrew forms the basis of subsequent dialects, students are advised that this is not a course in modern Hebrew.

Core Competencies:

This is a beginner's language course designed to equip the students with a basic competence in the reading of texts from the Hebrew Bible in the original language.
