This course will provide the student with an in-depth understanding of the basic issues in Chinese Buddhism and a general understanding of their role in the development of Japanese Buddhism.

Students will be exposed to philosophical, historical and cultural elements found in East Asian Buddhism. Modern methods of research will be demonstrated. Facts, authorities and movements will be studied.
