# **Course Description**

The status of the "other" in the Abrahamic religions.

This course will examine diverse aspects of the attitudes of Judaism, Christianity and Islam toward other religions and their communities, as well as to "heretical" sects and other unsanctioned groupings within their own religions. The issues will be studies as they relate to theology, religious law, social dynamics and historical developments.
