Course Description:

This course is a continuation of RELS 221, Classical Chinese for Religious Texts II. It will strengthen the students' abilities in Classical Chinese with emphasis on developing a stronger reading and translating knowledge of religious texts.

Core Competencies:

The student will become increasing fluent in the Classical language, technical terms, specific lexicons and grammar. Translating from Chinese to English will be focused on and students will develop abilities to read, translate, and understand Chinese religious texts. Methodology will also be discussed.

Course Requirements:

There will be two in class tests as well as a participation component to your marks. Possible total number of points =100.

Test I June 16 20 points Test II June 23 10 points Participation 70 points*

* Students must be ready to put their homework on the board for discussion when called on. Failure to be prepared will result in significant penalties being assessed to the participation mark. Students will be required to submit written copies of their translations by June 23. Details regarding this requirement will be given in class.
