Required Text:

A Treasury of Mahayana Sutras. (Ed.) Garma C.C. Chang

Course Description:

This course is focused on the Mahayana developments in India, with emphasis on conceptual aspects of the doctrine based on the sutra literature. It will be conducted in a seminar like manner. Instead of meeting each assigned class day, a schedule of no less than 12 full class meetings and 12 consultations will be organized in the first week. All students must attend the in class organizational meetings in the first week of classes.

Core Competencies:

Students will become aware of key concepts and cultural factors in the development of Indian Mahayana. They will gain knowledge of key issues, methodological considerations, and resources in the understanding of important implications for the field.

Course Requirements:

Students will be responsible for four group projects. This will include research, class debate, short paper, and list of resources. Each project will be worth 25 points, the total assigned score to be equally given to each team member. There will be a total of 100 possible points throughout the course.

There will be no Registrar scheduled final examination.

Grading:

A numerical mark will be given for each course requirement. A letter grade will be assigned on the following number and letter grade scheme:
