NOTES

This course provides a chronological overview of ancient history in Greece and Rome, from the 8th century B.C.E. to the 5th century C.E. It will explore aspects of politics, warfare, religion, culture, and society in order to give a solid understanding of ancient Greek and Roman history. In addition, students will be introduced to primary sources ranging from art and archaeology to literature and will learn to read them critically as source material for the past.

Although the PowerPoint slideshows from this course will be available on D2L, these are not a substitute for lecture notes, so it is essential that you attend the lectures.
