COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will explore religious action (ritual) and language (myth) among the ancient Greeks. How did religion inform their understanding of a human's situation in space and time? What was a person's divinely sanctioned place in the family, the city, and the cosmos? Each student will be required to assemble and evaluate the evidence about a particular Greek shrine, cult or festival (research project), and apply that evidence to the questions asked above (term paper). The midterm exam will test the student's general knowledge of the topics covered in the lectures.
