COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The classical period is regarded as the apex of ancient Greek history, and on it the spotlight is inevitably shone when speaking of the achievements of the ancient Greeks. However, the classical period was preceded by several formative centuries which laid the groundwork, making these achievements possible. The primary aim of this course is to study the main historical developments of these formative centuries, from the Bronze Age to the period just before the Persian Wars (roughly 3000-500 BC), a time-period collectively known as “Early Greece”.
