TEXTBOOKS

Wiedemann's book is a sourcebook, which assembles English translations of ancient texts discussing slavery in the ancient world. You can access it for free, using your university library log-in, via Ebrary. Of course, you are also welcome to purchase a print copy if you so prefer.

There may also be additional readings, both primary sources in translation and secondary sources, which will be posted on D2L throughout the semester. These will be noted in the syllabus.

NOTES

This course will explore various aspects of slavery during the Roman Republic and Roman Empire, with particular emphasis on discussions and representations of slaves and slavery in textual sources, including literature, legal texts, and inscriptions. Discussion will cover a wide variety of topics, such as the nature of Roman slavery, its economic and legal aspects, philosophical and religious discussions of slavery, and the experiences and lives of slaves themselves.
