NOTES

This course is a continuation of Latin 201 and will introduce you to Classical Latin as covered in the latter part of *Wheelock's Latin*. By the end of the semester, you should have increased your Latin vocabulary, learned more complicated grammatical structures, be able to compose Latin sentences from English, and be able to translate more complicated Latin passages, as a foundation for later reading of Classical texts. Because of the nature of this course, it is extremely demanding, with frequent assignments and quizzes as well as class participation.
