Assignments:

- 1. There will be 5 weekend assignments throughout the term, worth in total 20% of the final grade.
- 2. **Midterm test** worth 15% of the final grade. This will examine material from Pliny, and will include two passages for translation (one prepared, the other unseen), and short questions on grammar and content.
- 3. Readings from another Latin author, relevant to the student's interests, including a **translation and commentary** on a selected passage (20%).
- 4. Preparation for and active participation in class are essential, and will account for 15% of the course grade.
- 5. The **final examination**, worth 30%, will first examine material from Catullus and Horace (two prepared and one unseen passages, and short questions on grammar and content), and then require a short essay on a prepared topic concerning the literary, historical, and social contexts of the four authors studied in the course.
