Required Text(s): No specific texts are required. Any edition of Catullus' Poems and Cicero's letters to friends will be suitable, as long as it reports the modern numeration of paragraphs, and, in the case of Catullus, verses. Printed texts from on-line editions such as *The Latin Library*, *Lacus Curtius* etc. are welcome.

Course Description:

The purpose of this course is twofold: to strengthen students' understanding of the fundamentals of Latin syntax and morphology, and to develop skills for reading Latin prose and poetry independently. The class will read from the Cicero's letters to friends and Catullus' Poems. Lectures will include a review of Latin grammar learned in previous courses. As time permits, we will also discuss the relevant cultural and historical context in which these texts were produced.
