Course Description

This course will study Jewish, Christian, and Muslim thought and behaviour (or in religious studies terms, mythology and ritual) as outcomes of an evolved, naturally-selected human biology. In keeping with a university-level education, the assessments of this course will emphasize broad understanding, though not at the expense of some knowledge of the factual details of each religious tradition.
