Course Description:

This course is an introduction to the major religious traditions of India, China and Japan. We will be concerned with the origins and developments of these traditions, focusing on the central beliefs, practices, scriptures, and concepts which inform their respective worldviews. While we will raise certain contemporary issues and/or problems, the thrust of our discussions will centre around the 'classical' formulations of Hinduism and Buddhism as they appear in India, China and Japan.

Core Competencies:

Active participants in this course will gain an understanding of the fundamental terms, religious figures, concepts, beliefs and practices of the religious traditions considered. They will further their skills in the organisation and written communication of the knowledge they gain, and be encouraged to critically reflect on these traditions and their academic study.
