Required Books:

There will be no required textbook grammar and reading texts will be handed out in class.

General Remarks:

This course is an intensive introductory course of the Classical Tibetan Language.

Course Content:

This course will introduce the students to the alphabet and basic grammar of the Classical Tibetan Language. It will not inform the students on how to speak modern colloquial Tibetan.

Course Requirements

As the major purpose of this course is to acquaint the student with the application of Tibetan grammar by reading Tibetan texts, the final grade will be based upon the completion of the daily exercises, participation in the class, and comprehension of the basic grammar. It is expected that within the first few days, the student will study the alphabet in Tibetan Script so that the student will be able to follow the grammar using this script.

Students will be expected

- 1) to complete each assignment on a daily basis **(50 points)**
- 2) to participate in the classroom by having the daily exercises completed **(40 points)**
- 3) to submit a final clean copy of all exercises that have been corrected daily in the class **(10 points)**

Further information will be given in class.

There will be **no Registrar scheduled final** examination.
