Required Books:

There will be no required textbook. Grammar and reading texts will be handed out in class.

General Remarks:

This course is an intensive introductory course of the Classical Tibetan Language.

Course Content:

This course will introduce students to the alphabet and the basic grammar of the Classical Tibetan Language. It will not inform the student on how to speak modern colloquial Tibetan.

Course Requirements:

As the major purpose of this course is to acquaint the student with the application of Tibetan grammar by reading Tibetan texts, the final grade will be based upon the completion of the daily exercises, participation in class, and the comprehension of the basic grammar.

Students will be expected:

- 1) To complete 3 assignments to be handed in to the instructor [3 @ 10 points = 30 points]
- 2) To complete 2 tests [2 @ 10 points = 20 points]
- 3) To participate in the classroom by having the daily exercises completed [40 points]
- 4) To submit a final clean copy of all exercises that have been corrected daily in class [10 points]

Further information will be given in class.

There will be no registrar scheduled final examination.
