#### **Course Description**

This course will introduce students to the grammar, phonology and script of the Qur'an and classical Arabic, and cover the basic morphology and syntax of the written language. Although this course is not conversational Arabic, proper active skills (including oral presentation and pronunciation) are essential to understanding and appreciating the literary expression of the language in its historical context.

#### **Required Texts**

Thackston, Wheeler M. <u>An Introduction to Koranic and Classical Arabic: An Elementary Grammar of the Language</u>. Bethesda, MD: Iran Books, 1994.

#### **Core Competencies**

This course will stress the development of the four skills (reading, speaking, listening and writing) at the earliest stages. In addition to introducing these skills to the student, considerable time will be spent on studying the grammar of Arabic. We will also begin to read several of the styles of writing (Qur'an, Hadith, and early Islamic historiography).
