### **Course Description**

This course examines some fundamental philosophical and religious questions from a variety of perspectives, drawing upon Western and Eastern traditions. The course is not intended as a survey of these systems of thought but rather aims to encourage cross-cultural comparisons of metaphysical, ethical, and religious ideas.

Emphasis will be placed on developing analytical and critical thinking skills. Students will be encouraged to engage with these texts in order to reflect on some of the prevailing assumptions of contemporary societies.

N.B. All written assignments will be graded with regard to both form and content.

### Policy with regard to missed assignments/assessments

Paper topics will be distributed in class and will require students to engage in a cross-cultural comparison by drawing on Western and Eastern works. Late papers will be graded down at a rate of 3% a day. The paper can be handed in at any time during the semester prior to the deadline. The late deadline allows those students writing on works discussed later in the semester to attend the lectures on these books before handing in their paper. Having other assignments and tests due at this time will not be sufficient reason for extension. You have the option of handing the paper in earlier and choosing a topic that allows you to do so.

The in-class exams **MUST** be written on the date specified. Make-up tests will only be granted under *exceptional* circumstances and must be accompanied by appropriate documentation such as a doctor's note.

### **Expectations for student conduct in this course**

Students will be expected to attend classes and are encouraged strongly to participate in class discussions. I do not do make-up lectures for missed classes, nor do I distribute lecture notes therefore it is your responsibility to borrow notes off another student if you miss a class.
