Course Description:

This is an intermediary course on Classical Chinese for religious texts with Buddhist text focus. Students will enhance their intellectual tools by acquiring the ability to quickly translate ancient works. The course will consist of in-depth readings of texts dealing with practices and philosophy. Reading is the focus; there is no oral component. This course can be used for Religious Studies, Arts, and language requirements.

Core Competencies:

The students will improve abilities in analyzing ancient Chinese characters. Knowledge of grammar, Buddhist language technical terms and transliteration will also be improved. Proper translation methods will be taught. Students will further develop their skills in reading, translating, and analyzing religious texts in Classical Chinese.

Course Requirements:

There will be three in-class tests. Students must be able to discuss translations made at home in each class.
