Content and Objectives:

A critical examination of various theories used in the academic study of religion.

Assessments:

Contributions to Class Discussion - 20%

Students will need to email the instructor prior to each Monday a set of critical questions on the assigned readings.

Two Short Comparative Essays – 20% each

Two essays, comparing two theories/theorists of religion, 5-6 pages in length. Essay due dates: February 9 and March 9.

Final Essay - 40%

A 12-15 page analysis (historical and/or social) of the purpose and function of the discipline of Religious Studies in western society. Essay due on Friday, April 17th
