COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVE

This course will explore various texts from the philosophical tradition of Daoism. Themes to be addressed include the nature of the Dao, the sage, non-action, nothingness change, mystical awareness, knowledge, Daoist ethics, the cultivation of the self and the ideal ruler.

Objective: The objective of the course is to familiarize students with ways of thinking in the Daoist tradition as well as to enhance critical thinking and essay writing skills.
