#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will study certain major figures and texts in the philosophy of religion. Students will be asked to think critically about some of the important questions that have been raised in connection with knowledge, language, gender and religion. The texts will be studied not just with reference to their historical context, but also their continual relevance for today. As the course will be taught in seminar style, students will be presented with a list of terms and crucial ideas so that they will come to class informed for discussion.

#### **CORE COMPETENCIES**

As this is a theoretical course which covers developments in the history of philosophy and religion, students will learn both concepts and arguments, and their historical relevance. Students will thus learn to appreciate the critical roles of context; tools of analysis and philosophical exposition.

#### **COURSE REQUIREMENTS**

- 1) Short essays on 5 out of 6 of the philosophers studied, due one week after philosopher is treated in class. (approximately 1200 words each).Due 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct.; 16<sup>th</sup> Oct.; 6<sup>th</sup> Nov..; 20<sup>th</sup> Nov.; 27<sup>th</sup> Nov.; 11<sup>th</sup> Dec. 50%
