Course Description: This course surveys the history of theories of religion in the "western" academy. The course will explore the ways in which seminal western theorists of religion have established new definitions of religion and have cemented specific assumptions about the construction of religious boundaries in the academic study of religion. Towards the end of the course, we will explore scholarship by current post-colonial scholars questioning whether these definitions of traditions and religious boundaries are applicable to religious traditions rooted in Asia.

Course Requirements:

- 1) Bibliography: As this is a directed readings course, the student will submit a bibliography of proposed sources by July 15.
- 2) Participation: The Student and Professor will have at least 5 meetings to discuss readings. Pending travel to India, these meetings may take place over Skype or WhatsApp.
- 3) Final Paper: The Student will submit a 25-page final research paper by August 20.
