Content and Objectives:

A critical examination of various theories used in the academic study of religion.

Online elements for this course:

A schedule of assigned readings and assessments, as well as updates and announcements will be posted in D2L.

Assessments:

Class Lecture - 25%

Students will give a 50-minute class lecture, topic and date to be determined at the outset of the term.

Essay - 50%

A 25-30 page analysis on a topic to be decided by the end of the reading break. Essay due April 24th.

Presentation of Final Essay in Departmental Colloquium - 25%

Students will present a distilled version of their final essay in a public departmental colloquium during the last week of the term.

N.B. There is no Registrar-scheduled final exam in this course.
